Gil Resultan (December 8, 1934–June 26, 2020)

Gil Cayabyab Resultan, 85, passed away peacefully on June 26, 2020, surrounded by his loving family at his home in Fairfield, CA.

Gil was born on December 8, 1934, in Urbiztondo, Pangasinan, Philippines. His father, Enrique Sr., was a prominent judge who, along with his beloved mother, Teodora, raised Gil and his eight brothers and three sisters. Gil enlisted in the US Navy at age 18, where he served in the Korean and Vietnam Wars as a Navy Corpsman and Chief Petty Officer HMC. He proudly served on the USS Delta (AR-9) and the USS Banner (AGER-1). He was in the Fleet Marines Force, Echo 6, 2nd BN, 5th Marines, 3rd MAR DIV. Through the course of Gil's Navy career, he was stationed in Southern California (San Diego, Port Hueneme, Camp Pendleton, Miramar, and 29 Palms), Guam, Mariana Islands, and Yokosuka, Japan.

In the winter of 1959, in San Carlos City, Pangasinan, Philippines, he briefly met the love of his life, Consolacion, in his home town. They didn't fall in love until they reunited in New Jersey in 1961.

Following his Navy career, Gil served as a CA civil servant as a Registered Nurse. He worked at the California Medical Facility in Vacaville where he started the dialysis unit after studying at Stanford University to receive certification. He then worked as an RN and Supervisor at Napa State Hospital.

Gil loved spending time with family, especially with his grandchildren who were his pride and joy. He loved creating a home for his family that they could enjoy during gatherings, swim parties, and barbeques. He was thoughtful, generous, and always cared about his family in the US and Philippines. He lived his life happily with his wife, Consolacion, while worshipping Jesus, playing finger style Spanish guitar, enjoying tennis, swimming, fishing, camping, RV-ing, taking trips to Reno and Cache Creek, gardening, taking care of his

“grandbabies,” and watching them grow. He supported all his children and young family friends with words of wisdom. He always let his children know how proud he was of them.

Gil is survived and will be forever missed by his loving and devoted wife of 59 years, Consolacion; his younger brothers, Enrique Jr. and Michael; sisters-in-law Esperanza, Lalene and Aniceta; brother-in-law Johnny; children, Guy, Gilbert, Clarissa and Theodore; daughters-in-law, Yvonne and Beverly; sons-in-law, Keith and John; grandchildren, Julia, Jordan, Jacob, Matt, Katrina, and Matthew; numerous nieces and nephews in the US, Philippines and other countries.

A drive-by visitation (remain inside vehicle), will be held outside the funeral home. Please wear a mask.
